


EYFS Curriculum Overview - SU 1 - A Pirate's life for me

Skills:

- Write two or more words together using a finger space.
- Write a short phrase. E.G. a big cat
- Begin to write an I can see sentence using finger spaces and correct punctuation
- Use and apply phase 3 graphemes.
- Sequence a story
- Begin to anticipate events of a story
